Game: Red Light, Green Light



Red Light: Stop Green Light = Go

This is a standard kid game that is popular because kids think it cool to play it in a foreign language. It enhances communication skills such as listening, following directions, and bolstering impulse control.

This game has many different ways to play:


- 1. Teacher or a volunteer student serves as the caller for "Red Light, Green Light." The caller starts with calling green light, and may decide to call red light at any time. (He/she may call without looking at the class to add more suspense.)
- 2. Have all the children stand around the room. The purpose of this game is to create a fun way for students to practice vocabulary or new text by passing around objects or flash cards. When "Green light!" is called, students begin passing objects around the room. When the caller yells "Red light!" all students must stand perfectly still. The individuals who hold the object(s) or flash card(s) must call out what they have in hand. If they can name the objects/flash cards, they can become the caller.


