Areas of Parent Involvement

The Maryland State Department of Education provides leadership and guidance to local school systems in designing parent involvement programs.

After consulting with the Maryland State Department of Education, Comcast decided to use a nationallyrecognized framework for family involvement as a springboard to identifying the areas of involvement to be demonstrated by nominees for the Parent Involvement Matters Award.

While this framework is based on six types of parent involvement, we are seeking award nominees who demonstrate involvement in five areas. Nominees can demonstrate involvement in all five areas or only one, but the nominee must have made a significant, positive impact on public education with their involvement project within the last 24 months.

1.Communication

Fostering communication that impacts the school community.



Recruiting or organizing volunteers, or supporting school activities, both internal and external.

3. Learning



Organizing or coordinating learning activities that reinforce homework or classroom skills.

About the Award

The Comcast Parent Involvement Matters Award is an annual award for parents (and others with legal responsibility for a child) whose exemplary contributions to public education have led to improvements for Maryland's public school children, teachers, schools, programs, and/or policies. Comcast created the award with the Maryland State Department of Education to highlight the positive impact parents have on public schools and to encourage all parents to get involved in whatever way they can.

4. Decision Making



Participating on decision-making committees, or in programs that advocate system or policy changes, or serving as a representative for the school or education community.

5. Community Collaboration



Coordinating resources and services for the school community, which could include fundraisers that would enhance a school's services or environment, or coordinating resources or services from the school community that may serve an external community.

Examples of Award-Winning Parent Involvement

What would a Comcast Parent Involvement Matters Award winner look like?

He/she might demonstrate all of the five areas of parent involvement, or he/she might demonstrate only one area, but he/she will have made a real difference for students, parents, and schools.

The following are a few examples of possible awardwinning activities for explanatory purposes only. They do not represent the only types of activities that could win an award.

- Serve as a spokesperson for parents and be an active participant or leader of a school, district, or state committee that brings about major policy changes that support students and schools.
- Lead an effort with many partners—such as school staff, businesses, government entities, and the community—to develop a shared school-community park, playground, or other space or facility.

- Recruit and manage a network of volunteer translators to help non-English speaking parents communicate with the school and vice versa.
- Develop an interactive Web site that facilitates communication among parents, the school, and the larger community.
- Lead a group effort among school staff, local businesses, and local musicians to create a series of instructional clinics for students and performances for the school community.
- Develop and deliver a series of workshops for other parents on topics such as how to encourage academic achievement in children, how to be involved in the school, how to advocate for children with special needs, and more.

Eligibility

To be considered for the Comcast Parent Involvement Matters Award, nominees must:

- 1. Be a parent, which includes a natural parent, an adoptive parent, a legal guardian, a person acting as a parent of a child such as a relative or a stepparent with whom a child lives, and any other person legally responsible for the child's welfare.
- 2. Have a child in a Maryland public school.
- 3. Not be an employee of Comcast, the Maryland State Department of Education, or the Maryland public school system.
- 4. Have conducted or participated in the project for which he/she is nominated within the last 24 months.

Opportunities for Winners

After the celebration, the winner and semi-finalists will have many opportunities to be recognized and to promote parent involvement, such as:

- Participating in a public service announcement to be broadcast on Comcast cable television.
- Speaking at educational events and conferences.
- Appearing at Maryland State Board of Education and/or local board of education meetings.
- Participating on educational task forces and/or committees.
- Participating in a "best practices" publication and/or Web site that will serve to inspire parents as well as give them practical advice.

Selection

PROCESS

After reviewing all completed application submissions, judges will select 24 local award winners—one parent from each of the 23 counties in Maryland and one parent from Baltimore City. A second group of judges will review the 24 local winners' applications and select five semifinalists for the state-level award; interview them; and select one to be the state-level award winner.

Comcast will host an award celebration in April 2008 to recognize all 24 local winners. At the celebration, the names of the semi-finalists and the winner will be announced. The winner and semi-finalists will each receive a monetary award to further parent involvement activities.

CRITERIA

To qualify for the award, the nominee shall:

- 1. Be a consistent advocate of public education.
- Have had a significant, positive impact on public education with his/her creativity, innovation, and/or commitment at the school, district, or state level in one or more of the following areas:
 - Communication
 - Volunteering
 - Learning
 - Decision Making
 - Community Collaboration
