This year, MSDE will become a part of the domestic violence solution, while helping victims survive the odds. Wireless phones and technology can serve as a vital link to emergency or support services in a time of crisis or as a reliable, safe connection to employers, family and friends, as survivors rebuild their lives.

The **HopeLine Phone Program**, sponsored through Verizon Wireless, collects no-longer-used wireless phones, batteries, and accessories in <u>any</u> condition from <u>any</u> wireless service provider. The refurbished phones, complete with 3,000 minutes of wireless services, are provided to local domestic violence organizations or local government and law enforcement agencies throughout the State for use with their domestic violence clients.

Nearly one in four women, one in nine men, and more than 3 million children have been affected by domestic violence. Not only are old cell phones lifesaving resources for victims of domestic violence, by properly disposing them, we will help in keeping tons of electronic waste and batteries out of landfills—MSDE Thinks Green!
