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Who is the ESOL Teacher?

- In Maryland, certified English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) teachers have specialized, graduate level training in the academic content area of **English as a new language**
 - Second language acquisition
 - ESOL teaching methods
 - English grammar (academic & interpersonal)

What do ESOL teachers do?

- Teach interpersonal and academic English to students who are learning **English as a new language**
- Provide explicit, structured, and systematic **English language development (ELD)** instruction in the four language skills: *listening, speaking, reading and writing*

How is ESOL instruction organized?

- In Maryland, federally mandated **English language proficiency (ELP)** standards are aligned to English and Reading/Language Arts
- In MCPS, the ESOL curriculum is aligned to the Maryland ELP standards and the reading and writing standards in the MCPS English and Reading/Language Arts curricula

How is ESOL instruction provided?

- In MCPS, the ESOL teacher provides explicit, structured, systematic ELD instruction to ESOL students using the ESOL curriculum
- ELD occurs during the student's English or Reading/Language Arts time
- ELD may also be content-based, i.e., occur in the content areas of math, science, social studies, or English Reading/Language Arts
- ESOL teachers focus on teaching *English as a new language*, **NOT** academic content

Considerations for ESOL Teacher Evaluation

- All states have federally mandated Annual Measureable Achievement Objective (AMAO) I and II targets in English language proficiency (ELP)
 - ✓ AMAO I: Progress toward ELP
 - ✓ AMAO II: Attainment of ELP
- The students of ESOL teachers should meet or exceed AMAO I and II targets each year

Considerations for ESOL Teacher Evaluation

- ESOL teachers should provide evidence of data-driven decision making by:
 - ✓ Using a variety of formal and informal assessment techniques to measure listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in English.
 - ✓ Analyzing student information and results and planning ELD instruction accordingly.

Considerations for ESOL Teacher Evaluation

- ESOL teachers should provide evidence of commitment to continuous improvement and professional development by:
 - ✓ Reflecting upon their practice in promoting ELD and adjust instruction accordingly.
 - ✓ Drawing upon educational research and research-based strategies in planning and delivering ELD instruction.
 - ✓ Being active members of professional learning communities.

Considerations for ESOL Teacher Evaluation

- ESOL teachers should provide evidence of professionalism by:
 - ✓ understanding and supporting the **vision** of the school system.
 - ✓ Viewing themselves as a **leader** in the educational community.
 - ✓ **Contributing to the smooth functioning** of the school environment.
