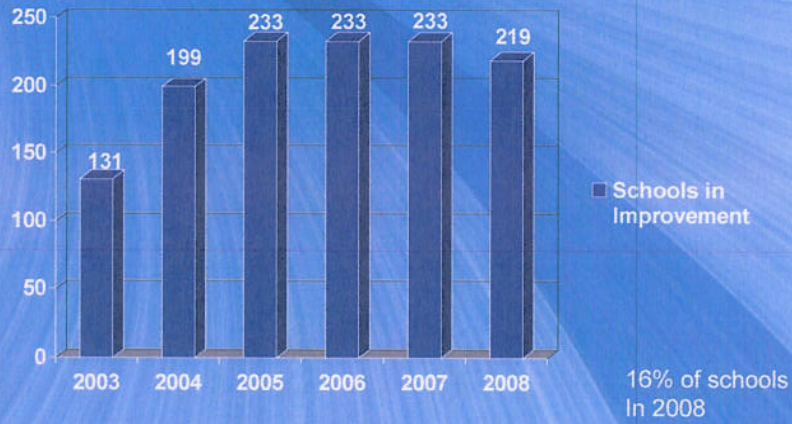

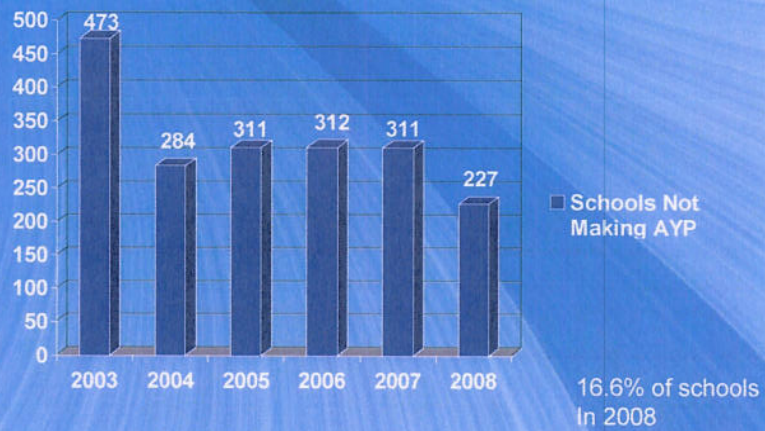
Transition to NCLB

 - Restructuringbased on number of years in Reconstitution and inability to meet AYP targets in 2002-03

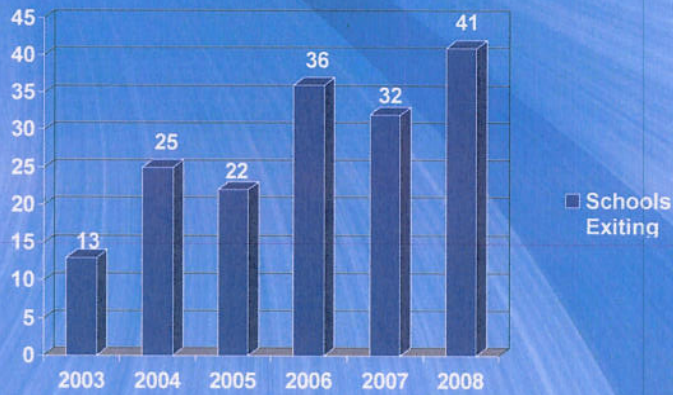
School Improvement Under NCLB: *Schools in Improvement*
