ASSESSMENT DESIGN

The PARCC assessment system will be comprised of four components. For English Language Arts, there is a fifth component.

Component #1: Diagnostic Assessment

Characteristics:

- Administered in grades 3 11 for English Language Arts, and Mathematics; high school will test Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II
- Optional
- Could be used throughout the year
- Computer-delivered
- Not included in summative score

Decisions:

- State Board of Education
 - o Will Maryland choose to administer and fund?
- PARCC
 - o If state does not administer and fund, will LEAs be able to choose to administer and fund, either individually or collaboratively?
- LEA
 - o If PARCC offers the option to LEAs to individually administer and fund, LEAs decide to participate.

Component #2: Mid-Year Assessment

Characteristics:

- Administered in grades 3 11 for English Language Arts, and Mathematics; high school will test Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II
- Performance-based
- Optional
- Potentially summative
- Computer-delivered

Decisions:

- State Board of Education
 - Will Maryland choose to administer and fund?
 - o If state chooses to administer and fund, will it choose to include in summative score that would be extracted for comparison across consortium states, and for state data?

PARCC

o If state does not administer and fund, will LEAs be able to choose to administer and fund, either individually or collaboratively?

• LEAs

o If PARCC offers the option to LEAs to individually administer and fund, LEAs decide to participate

Component #3: Performance-Based Assessment

Characteristics:

- Administered in grades 3 11 for English Language Arts, and Mathematics; high school will test Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II
- State funds assessment
- Required
- Part of summative score
- Maximum time requirement for each discipline: 180 minutes
- Computer-delivered

Decisions:

- USDE (Currently ESEA states that students must be tested at grade level.)
 - Will students in middle school take grade level assessment or Algebra assessment (if they are enrolled in Algebra course)?
- State Board of Education
 - Until ESEA is reauthorized, will Maryland choose to delay full administration of PARCC assessments?
 Maryland, as a governing state, must participate in field-testing.

Component #4: End of Year Assessment

Characteristics:

- Administered in grades 3 11 for English Language Arts, and Mathematics; high school will test Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II
- State funds assessment
- Required
- Part of summative score
- Intended for rapid turnaround scoring
- Innovative, computer-based items
- Computer-delivered

Decisions:

- USDE (Currently ESEA states that students must be tested at grade level.)
 - Will students in middle school take grade level assessment or Algebra assessment (if they are enrolled in Algebra course)?
- State Board of Education
 - Until ESEA is reauthorized, will Maryland choose to delay full administration of PARCC assessments?
 Maryland, as a governing state, must participate in field-testing.

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Component #5: English Language Arts Speaking and Listening

Characteristics:

- Administered in grades 3 11
- Required
- State-funded
- Not included in summative score

Decisions:

- PARCC
 - o The state may determine the timing of the assessment
- State Board of Education
 - Will the state allow each LEA to determine the timing of the assessment?
- LEAs
 - Will the LEA allow each school/teacher to determine the timing of the assessment?
 - How/will the assessment be incorporated into the student's grade?
