1965

Pres. Johnson signs the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA)







Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965 included 6 sections:

Title I: Financial Assistance for students in poverty

Title II: Libraries and Instructional Resources

Title III: Supplemental Education Resources/Centers

Title IV: Educational Research and Training

Title V: Strengthen State Education Departments

Title VI: General Provisions



1968

Congress reauthorized ESEA adding programs for :

- Migrant Children
- Neglected or Delinquent Children
- Bilingual Children





1970

Supplement *Not* Supplant was added to Title I



Title I is the icing on the cake!







1978

ESEA Reauthorized

Schools with 75% or more low-income students could operate Title I Schoolwide Programs

Also, US Department of Education was established under President Jimmy Carter.



1981



Reauthorization of ESEA

Education Consolidation and Improvement Act (ECIA)

Title I renamed as "Chapter I".







1988

Hawkins-Stafford Elementary and Secondary School Improvement Act (ESSIA)

- Required annual review of the effectiveness of Chapter I
- Required Program Improvement
- Expanded Schoolwide programs





1989

Governor's Education Summit

Called for national goal setting in the areas of educational accountability and standards

1994

Reauthorization of ESEA Improving America's Schools Act (IASA)

- States had to develop standards and align the tests for all students
- Schoolwide model significantly expanded
- "Chapter I" goes back to "Title I"









2002

President Bush signed the
No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB)



Goal of Title I: Ensure that all children have equal opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach at a minimum proficiency on challenging State academic achievement assessments.



ESEA under NCLB has 10 Titles:

Title I: Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

Title II: Preparing, Training, and Recruiting High-Quality Teachers and Principals

Title III: Language Instruction for Limited-English Proficient and Immigrant Student

Title IV: 21st Century

Title V: Innovative Programs and Parent Choice

Title VII: Indian, Native Hawaiian, & Alaska Native Education


