# How Does the Federal Uniform Grant Guidance Impact Your Work in Your LEA?

#### **Directions for Group Work:**

  - d. Performance Measurement

#### 2. What work is already underway in your LEA?

Recognizing your work and that of others is critical to developing allies. Respecting and understanding the work being done on your topic is critical to collaboration.

Relationship building takes time! Interactions must be ongoing. Shared activities lead to bigger opportunities for collaboration and effective allocation of resources. Keep reaching out to individuals, organizations, offices/divisions that may have an impact on your work.
